

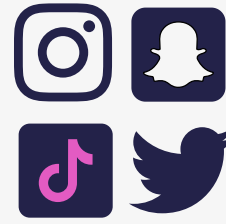
WHERE TO REPORT ONLINE ABUSE

LAW ENFORCEMENT

Reporting to your local police or sheriff's department is a common 1st step. A police report can also be helpful evidence when reporting to others in this guide.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Internet crime falls under the FBI's jurisdiction. Reports can be made online via their Internet Crime Complaint Center (ic3) [here](#).



COLLEGES & HIGH SCHOOLS

Incidents can be reported to schools directly, often via a Title IX reporting system & to the Dept. of Education's Office of Civil Rights [here](#).



EMPLOYER

May be an option if the abuse is occurring at work; perpetrated by a co-worker or affecting the victim's job performance.



COURTS

Restraining orders are sought in civil courts to stop the abuse, take down any abusive content and prevent future acts of harm.
